

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS MARCH 23, 2022



- Council directed staff to solicit comments from residents within 800 metres of the <u>Royal Canadian Legion Branch No. 99</u> regarding a new outdoor patio area for the Liquor Primary Licence held at 322 Main Street.
 - Council authorized Staff to apply for a <u>Federal Active Transportation Planning Grant</u> in the amount of \$50K to conduct a feasibility study for a Sicamous Narrows Active Transportation Bridge.
 - Council adopted <u>Zoning Bylaw No. 1007, 2022</u> to rezone a portion of 806 Trans-Canada Highway from C.2 Highway Tourist Commercial to C.2A Highway Tourist Commercial Residential for the development of a six-storey building with residential, visitor accommodation and commercial use.
 - Council gave First, Second and Third Reading to <u>2022-2026 Financial Plan Bylaw No. 1018</u>. This
 bylaw is required to be adopted annually and includes projected operating and capital expenses.
 The public is encouraged to review the <u>2022 Budget Highlights</u> and <u>2022 Financial Plan</u>
 Presentation.
 - Council gave a Second and Third Reading to <u>Animal Control Bylaw No. 1013, 2022</u>. This bylaw, once adopted, will replace *Dog Control Bylaw No. 228, 1997* and will include provisions that will require responsible ownership of all pets..
 - Council adopted <u>Policy PW-6 Pre-Qualified Contractor List</u> which allows contractors to apply in advance for short-term projects or works within the community. This policy replaces Policy PW-6 Equipment-Contractors for Hire.
 - Council agreed to join the <u>City of Nelson</u> in donating \$1K along to support the Red Cross Ukrainian Humanitarian Campaign.
 - Council authorized one \$1K scholarship and two \$500 scholarships to be awarded to 2022 Eagle River Secondary graduates pursuing a post secondary education.
 - Council directed Staff to prepare a letter of support to the British Columbia Craft Brewers Guild, BC Restaurant and Food Services Association, Alliance of Beverage Licensees and Restaurants Canada, who are jointly calling for the <u>reduction of patio-application red tape</u> for B.C.'s hospitality sector and economic recovery.
