

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS | JUNE 8, 2022



- The Flockhart family presented original artwork, inspired by the First Nations pictographs at Mable Lake, to be placed in the new Shuswap Healing Centre.
- Following a Public Hearing, <u>Zoning Amendment Bylaw 1020, 2022</u> was given Third Reading, which would reduce the rear setback in the R1A—Urban Single Family Residential zone from 6m to 5m.
- Following a Public Hearing, Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1021, 2022 was given
 Third Reading, which would allow secondary suites within the Two-Family
 dwelling located at 506/508 Kappel Street.
- Council approved <u>Development Variance Permit 22-108-DVP</u> to vary the exterior side setbacks from 3.0m to 1.2m for a park model and addition at 125, 1383 Silver Sands Road.
- Council Procedure Amending Bylaw No. 1015, 2022 was adopted which provides for fully electronic meetings, clarifies meetings and electronic participation and allows agenda order revisions.
- The <u>2021 Annual Corporate Report</u> is now available for public inspection and the Annual Meeting has been scheduled for June 22, 2022 during the Regular Council Meeting. The public is invited to review the report online or at District Hall and submit any comments to the Corporate Officer.
- Council provided direction to Staff regarding topics of discussion and meeting requests with Provincial cabinet ministers at the upcoming 2022 UBMC Convention being held in Whistler, B.C.
- Council directed Staff to update the <u>District of Sicamous Naming Policy PW-8</u>
 to include all District owned assets, such as trails, buildings and beaches, not
 just roadways. It will also create guidelines on how to put forth a name for a
 District asset and how the District will engage the public on those decisions.
